

RANGOLI

Rangoli is an art form originating in the Indian subcontinent, in which patterns are created on the floor using materials such as powdered limestone, red ochre, dry rice flour, coloured sand, quartz powder, flower petals, and coloured rocks.

It is an everyday practice in Hindu households. Rangoli are usually made during Diwali, Onam, Pongal, Sankranthi and other Hindu festivals. Designs are passed from one generation to the next, keeping both the art form and the tradition alive.

Rangoli designs can be simple geometric shapes, depictions of deities, or flower and petal shapes appropriate to the given celebrations. They can also be made with elaborate designs crafted by numerous people. Synthetic colours are a modern variation. Other materials include red brick powder and even flowers and petals, as in the case of flower rangoli.
