# Challenge & Opportunity

The need is for a learning ecosystem that fosters the formation of creative, collaborative groups; groups that converge to challenge their own and others' assumptions; an environment where students engage in learning that matters to them and that will make a positive difference to their own world and experience.

Organisations increasingly see diversity as a driver of innovation; the ability to collaborate in complex teams is an important skill for everyone, not just those who work in global companies or who will live overseas. Groups displaying a range of perspectives and skill levels outperform like-minded experts.

Simply being part of a multi-national, multi-racial, multi-age environment will not accomplish inclusivity. We must evolve the understanding of our identities to a more nuanced and complex view and acknowledge that we are simultaneously members of many groups and our identities are interwoven and overlapping. We must provide intentional experiences to help our students develop intercultural competency.
